

Limavady Grammar School Uniform Policy From September 2026

1. Introduction

At Limavady Grammar School, our uniform is a visible reflection of our school motto: Vita, Veritas, Victoria (Life, Truth, Victory). It serves as a symbol of our shared identity, fostering a sense of belonging and pride within our community. We believe that a uniform minimises social distractions and allows our pupils to focus on our core mission: Learning, Caring, and Preparing for Life.

In accordance with the School Uniforms (Guidelines and Allowances) Act (Northern Ireland) 2026, (herein after referred to as "the 2026 Act") this policy ensures:

- **Minimal Branding:** Branded items are kept to a minimum to allow for high-street/supermarket alternatives.
- **Value for Money:** All items are selected based on durability and cost-effectiveness.
- **Inclusivity:** Reasonable adjustments are made for pupils with SEND.

2. Policy Aims

The aims of this policy are:

- **To Foster Inclusion and Equality:** To ensure that all pupils, regardless of socio-economic background, feel an equal part of the LGS community by minimising visible differences in wealth through uniform.
- **To Ensure Affordability:** To limit the number of branded or "sole-supplier" items in line with 2026 legislative caps, maximising the use of generic, high-street alternatives for core items like shirts, trousers, skirts and coats.
- **To Support Sustainability:** To promote the environmental benefits of "pre-loved" uniforms through our school-led recycling initiatives and the LGS Parents' Association uniform exchange.
- **To Prioritise Practicality and Comfort:** To provide a uniform that is fit for the rigors of a modern school day, including a streamlined, cost-effective PE kit that facilitates participation in our wide range of extra-curricular sports.
- **To Maintain High Standards:** To ensure that students are prepared for life beyond school by encouraging a professional appearance and a disciplined approach to personal presentation.
- **To Guarantee Transparency:** To provide parents and guardians with clear, up-to-date information regarding costs and a choice of at least three competitive suppliers for any required branded elements.

3. The Uniform Requirements

School uniform regulations will be strictly enforced, and parents are asked to co-operate fully with the school in this matter.

3.1 School Uniform Regulations

- Outdoor coats may be worn and must be plain navy blue or black with a plain dark lining. Raincoat, overcoat, anorak or duffel coat, not bomber jacket, corduroy, waxed coat, denim or material stitched to resemble denim.
- School scarf with fleecy back (or knitted school scarf) both optional.
- Navy woollen bobble hat with school crest (optional)
- Hoodies may not be worn as part of school uniform.
- Shoes must be plain black with flat heels – not suede or nubuck (or similar) or canvas. Soles should be smooth or only slightly ridged. Training shoes and boots are not permitted, nor are Vans, Converse or similar styles. Laces must be the same colour as the shoes.
- Details of the PE/Games uniform are provided to all new pupils.
- All items of uniform and bags must be clearly marked with the owner's name.

Uniform Regulations for Girls

- Navy blue – not black – school blazer with crest.
- Navy blue six panel skirt to the knee, not tight fitting (Years 8-10); navy kick-pleat skirt below the knee (Years 11-14)
- Navy regulation girls' trousers may be worn.
- White school blouse (buttoned to neck), tucked into skirt waistband and school tie.
- Navy blue V-necked pullover or cardigan (no motifs except the school crest) may be worn under the blazer (optional).
- Navy blue knee socks worn to the knee or navy blue heavy-weight tights.

Summer uniform (optional) – from 18 March until end of June:

- White 3/4 length sleeve school blouse with school crest
- Navy slipover with school crest

General

- Lapel badges must be confined to school badges, Duke of Edinburgh's Award and major Youth Organisations, e.g. Scouts or Guides and a maximum of one charity badge.
- Make-up in any form, including nail varnish, should be natural and subtle. Hair must be clean and tidy, and in a style and of a natural colour acceptable to the school, e.g. not dyed, streaked or shaven. Any hair accessories must be discreet/plain and in school colours.
- Only basic jewellery, i.e. watches and one plain ring may be worn. Small, plain ear rings may be worn. Facial jewellery is not permitted.

Uniform Regulations for Boys

- Navy blue – not black – school blazer with crest
- Charcoal grey or black flannel trousers. Not “skinny legs.”
- White shirt and school tie. Shirts should be plain and formal, no badges or leisure shirt features.
- Navy V-necked pullover (no motifs except the school crest) may be worn under the blazer (optional).
- Dark grey or black socks – not light grey, white or coloured.

Summer uniform (optional) – from 18 March until end of June:

- White short sleeve school shirt with school crest
- Navy slipover with school crest
- Lapel badges must be confined to school badges, Duke of Edinburgh’s Award and major Youth Organisations, e.g. Scouts, and a maximum of one charity badge.
- Hair must be clean and tidy, neither too long nor too short, and in a style and of a natural colour acceptable to the school, e.g. not dyed, streaked or shaven. Boys are encouraged to be clean shaven. Any facial hair must be kept neat and tidy.
- Only basic jewellery, i.e. watches and one plain ring may be worn and belts must be simple in design. Small, plain ear rings may be worn. Facial jewellery is not permitted.

P.E. and Games Kit & Equipment

Boys P.E.

- Plain navy shorts or Kukri navy and blue shorts;
- Plain white top or Kukri games jersey
- White socks;
- Sports trainers (not fashion trainers/converse)

***Kukri navy and blue shorts / Games top can also be worn for PE**

Boys Games

- Kukri navy and blue shorts;
- Kukri Games jersey;
- LGS branded/Kukri socks;
- Sports trainers (not fashion trainers/converse);
- Rugby or football boots;
- Towel
- Gum shield and shin guards.
- School Tracksuit (Kukri brand) *optional plain navy tracksuit bottoms can be worn.

Girls P.E.

- Kukri white and navy top (used for both PE and Games);
- White ankle socks;
- Plain navy shorts of appropriate length and not tight fitting or plain navy sports leggings: sports leggings must be opaque (non-see through) and suitable for active movement and offer full coverage. Please note that black leggings are not acceptable;

- Sports trainers (not fashion trainers/converse)

Girls Games

- Kukri white and navy top (used for both PE and Games);
- Skort or athletic navy shorts of appropriate length and not tight fitting;
- White knee length sports socks;
- Towel;
- Sports trainers (not fashion trainers/converse);
- Gum shield and shin guards
- School Tracksuit (Kukri brand) *optional plain navy tracksuit bottoms can be worn

All compression clothing ('skins') or under armour garments must be in school colours.

Please note that any unbranded clothing must be plain i.e. no logo.

* Please note that if your child is pursuing competitive hockey you are advised to purchase correct astro turf trainers and a hockey stick.

No black rubber-soled shoes may be worn in the Sports Hall.

All pupils are advised that they should wear their gumshield during Hockey and Rugby training/matches.

NB No football shirts or shorts are permitted.

ALL ARTICLES MUST BE CLEARLY MARKED WITH OWNER'S NAME

Personal Protective Equipment for Sport

When taking part in sport in school, Limavady Grammar School strongly advise the use of mouthguards when participating in Rugby and Hockey.

Mandatory items

Hockey: shin guards must be worn for training and competitive matches

Football: shin guards must be worn for training and competitive matches

Cricket: helmets and boxes when batting using a hard ball and fielding close to the bat

Although wearing Personal, Protective Equipment will not guarantee complete protection from injury, it can, in many cases mitigate the severity of the injury.

5. Equality and Inclusion

At Limavady Grammar School, our uniform policy is rooted in the belief that every pupil should feel a sense of belonging, regardless of their background, identity, or individual needs. In accordance with the 2026 Statutory Guidance, this policy is designed to be inclusive and non-discriminatory. We recognise our duty under the Equality Act to make reasonable adjustments for pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), including sensory-sensitive fabric alternatives or modifications to fastenings where required.

Furthermore, the school respects the diverse cultural and religious identities within the Roe Valley community; the wearing of plain black or navy religious headwear is fully supported as part of our standard uniform. Our "Pre-loved" uniform initiative further ensures that high-quality school wear is accessible to all, upholding our commitment to a school environment where every student is valued, supported, and treated with dignity.

6. Sustainability and Support

- **Uniform Bank:** The school operates a "Pre-loved Uniform Store" available to all families. This promotes sustainability and reduces costs.
- **Uniform Grants:** Families eligible for Free School Meals may apply for the Education Authority (EA) School Clothing Allowance, which has been extended under the 2026 Act.

7. Expectations and Monitoring

7.1 Student and Parent Responsibilities

At Limavady Grammar School, pupils report that they wear their uniform with pride. We expect all pupils to adhere to the uniform policy as a demonstration of their commitment to our school community and the high standards of Limavady Grammar School. Students are expected to wear the correct uniform daily, including travel to and from school, ensuring they represent LGS with pride in the local community.

Parents and Guardians are asked to support the school by ensuring their child has the necessary items and by labelling all clothing clearly to minimise loss.

7.2 Monitoring Procedures

In line with our Positive Behaviour Policy, monitoring is conducted with a focus on "Connection before Correction."

Daily Check: Form Tutors conduct a visual uniform check during morning registration.

Subject Teacher Oversight: Staff will monitor uniform throughout the school day, including in corridors and during PE transitions.

Constructive Dialogue: If a pupil is not in the correct uniform, the Form Tutor or member of school staff will engage in a private, reflective dialogue to understand the reason.

8. Consultation and Review

The Uniform Policy will be reviewed within 3 years of the previous review, or as required.

- **Last Consulted:** March 2026
- **Next Review:** By March 2029
- **Method:** This policy was developed in consultation with the Students and Parents following consultation.
